**BAY AREA CELEBRITY TO SHARE TALENT AT  
BENEFIT FOR THE  
GLOBAL AIDS INTERFAITH ALLIANCE (GAIA)**

*Author Anne Lamott speaks  
Archbishop Desmond Tutu and Maria Shriver are Honorary Chairs*

**SAN FRANCISCO, CA (December 1, 2008)** -- Author Anne Lamott will speak at a spring benefit for the Global AIDS Interfaith Alliance in the gardens of Woodside supporters on Sunday, May, 3, 2009( 4-7PM). Nobel Peace Laureate Archbishop Desmond Tutu is Honorary Chair; Maria Shriver, First Lady of California, is Honorary Co-Chair.

"I know a lot of us feel a lot of hopelessness and powerlessness" said Lamott about the AIDS pandemic. "GAIA is one place where there are small daily miracles... That is what Bill and GAIA are doing -- taking the breath and spirit of caring attention to people who were scared to death, and now they are not."

The Global AIDS Interfaith Alliance ([www.thegaia.org](http://www.thegaia.org)) partners with local leaders and organizations in the Central African country of Malawi to feed, clothe, and educate AIDS orphans; empower village women; provide HIV testing; and train in HIV prevention. All proceeds from the benefit will support GAIA's work in the villages of Malawi, a country of nearly 13 million where about 14% of the adult population is infected with HIV/AIDS and over 550,000 children have been orphaned by AIDS (*Source: UNAIDS*).

"We're extremely excited and honored to have the support of Archbishop Tutu and many others" said GAIA President The Rev. William Rankin. "We hope that this event will raise both awareness and funds for HIV prevention and care in a desperately poor country."

**\$50** feeds and clothes and orphan for one year  
**\$100** pays for yearly secondary school fees for an orphaned child  
**\$500** employs a village woman to be a caregiver  
**\$1,000** buys five bicycle ambulances for transporting patients  
**\$5,000** supports a project providing food, life skills training, and care to 270 people living with HIV/AIDS for a year
